#### **RETIREES - Medicare Reimbursement**

From time to time, I remind our retirees about the Medicare Part B reimbursement portion of our plan. If you or your spouse are Medicare age, 65, and enrolled in Medicare Part A & B, you are eligible for reimbursement of the Part B Premium. The Plan will reimburse your Medicare premium up to \$99.50 per month every January and July. This only pertains to members and spouses that opted out of the management/executive plan and retired prior to March 26, 2017. You must contact Alight Solutions (Hewitt) at 1-877-228-4010 to enroll for the reimbursement. Once you're signed up, you won't have to sign-up again.

#### **HEALING AND SELF-REFLECTION**

#### Loren Meyers, Plantwide Safety Chairman

As we welcome 2025, I challenge all our UAW members to make the effort to reflect on 2024 to see what we could do differently in 2025 to move forward and improve from such a trying year. 2024 was a tragic year for our UAW members with the loss of life and serious injuries. We can point fingers in all directions and place blame, but we need to focus on what we as a membership can do together to improve what we have control over and can improve.

#### **Examples**

The Continuous Improvement card system has failed due to no accountability by management to follow its own process. I am not telling members to not use it, but it's only good use is for documentation. Management likes to throw "did you fill out a C.I card" into our members' face when there is a near miss or injury in order to place blame. When I go on monthly safety walks with management, we always run into some employees that put in a dozen or more C.I. cards and only received 1 back with no action. But, UAW safety representatives are not being asked by these members to help correct the issues.

I recently had one of our members come to me about a contractor using chemicals to strip paint off the floor and our member had filled out multiple C.I. cards because he has a documented respiratory reaction to the fumes. The member was upset because nothing was getting done and his C.I cards were ignored or lost. I instructed him to ask for his UAW safety representative. I received a blank stare from our member, and he said he would rather submit another C.I. card. Why continue to use a broken system not supported by management when you can use your UAW safety complaint system that is supported by our contract language?

Several UAW members have complained about not wanting to go to KK medical because of abusive and unprofessional behavior from medical staff when reporting accidents, returning from medical or basic safety procedures. If you go to medical and you feel you are not being represented in a professional manner, call for your UAW safety representative.

The nurse's pledge, also known as the Nightingale Pledge, is a solemn oath taken by nurses worldwide as they enter the noble profession of nursing. Named after Florence Nightingale, the founder of modern nursing, the pledge embodies the core values and principles that guide nurses in their practice. The pledge embodies nine key elements. The first five of which medical staff have compromised. The company's "Well-Being" has seemed to taken a priority over the employees' health and well-being.

- Devotion to Humanity: The pledge underscores the nurse's unwavering dedication to the well-being of all individuals, regardless of their race, creed, or socioeconomic status. It emphasizes that nurses should prioritize the health and comfort of their patients above all else.
- 2. **Compassion and Empathy:** Nurses pledge to approach their patients with kindness, understanding, and empathy. They recognize the vulnerability of those under their care and strive to provide emotional support along with medical attention.



- 3. **Respect for Dignity:** Nurses vow to uphold the dignity and privacy of their patients, recognizing that they are more than just medical cases. Respecting their autonomy and individuality is central to the nursing profession.
- 4. **Advocacy for Patients:** The pledge highlights the role of nurses as advocates for their patients. Nurses are encouraged to ensure that their patients receive appropriate care and treatment and to voice concerns on their behalf when necessary.
- Integrity and Ethics: Nurses commit to maintaining the highest standards of ethical conduct in their practice. This includes honesty, accountability, and a commitment to patient confidentiality. https://www.linkedin.com/pulse/what-nurses-pledgedoes-really-mean-nursedge

UAW members that report an accident must fill out an accident report. There are questions on this paper that are worded to trap the individual. Tell the truth! But don't give any information that didn't contribute to the incident. Recently a UAW member was walking into KK facility and tripped and seriously injured his shoulder. He made the comment that he "might" have dragged his toe. He wasn't sure but he wanted to be helpful. Management ruled that walking in the building is an unsafe act. There were lots of other factors but when your investigation is one-sided, and the company cares only about metrics then there is no shame to blame.

Let's start 2025 and don't fall into Managements trap. When you see a hazard, report it to your supervisor, not a team lead, they are part of the trap. Ask for a UAW safety representative; if one is not available ask for your steward. If you are involved in an accident, tell the truth but be careful of the statement you make and what you say. Every word will be used against you. If you go into a meeting with management for any reason and feel that any disciplinary or adverse action is being taken, invoke your Weingarten Rights immediately.




