Hello Brothers and Sisters!

I hope everyone is staying cool and safe this summer. As I'm writing this article, a lot of retirees have received in the mail the UAW Retired Membership Survey. First thing is that this survey is legitimate and should be filled out and sent back in. Second, the reason why they have sent this out is because they have redefined what a retiree is. For all these years retirees were defined as someone who receives a pension. But, over the last 20 years a lot of places have gotten away from pension plans and have gone with 401k's. Up until November of 2025 for the members that receive 401k's, they were never considered a retiree when they left their employment. So, International updated the interpretation to include those members that left their employment with at least 5 years of service and were at least the age of 62 (This will change in November due to what was approved at the convention that was held in June to 10 years of service and at least the age of 55). With all that being said, the biggest reason why they need these surveys back is because sometime in August ballots will be sent out to vote for the International Executive Board and they need to make sure ballots are only being sent to eligible voters.

I want to also mention that once this paper comes out, we will only be a few months away from Annual Enrollment. So, if you have been thinking about making any changes to your Caterpillar health coverage, now and for the next few months would be a good time to start putting a game plan together. The next paper after this will be the one in October and I wanted to make sure you have plenty of time to think about any changes you might want to make.

RETIREES – Medicare Reimbursement

From time to time, I remind our retirees about the Medicare Part B reimbursement portion of our plan. If you or your spouse are Medicare age, 65, and enrolled in Medicare Part A & B, you are eligible for reimbursement of the Part B Premium.

The Plan will reimburse your Medicare premium up to \$99.50 per month every January and July. This only pertains to members and spouses that opted out of the management/executive plan and retired prior to March 26, 2017. **You must contact B-Swift at 1-833-735-2127 to enroll for the reimbursement. Once you're signed up, you won't have to sign-up again.**

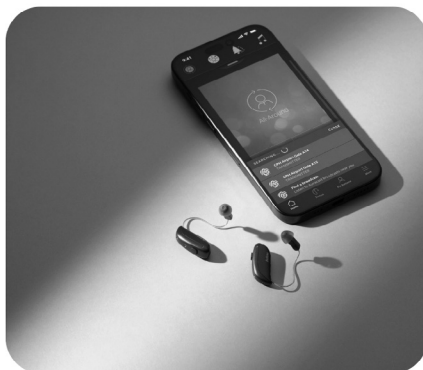

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250 YEARS

The Fourth of July traces back to **July 2, 1776**, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve the **Lee Resolution**, declaring the thirteen American colonies independent from British rule. The formal **Declaration of Independence**, primarily drafted by **Thomas Jefferson** with input from a five-member committee including John Adams and Benjamin Franklin, was debated, revised, and officially adopted on **July 4, 1776**. This document announced that the colonies were no longer subject to **King George III** and were united as free and independent states. **NO MORE KINGS.**

Most Significant Workers' Safety Acts in American History

Several landmark laws and events in U.S. history fundamentally transformed workplace safety, moving from largely unregulated conditions to federal oversight and protections.

1. Massachusetts Factory Acts (1877)

The first state-level factory safety and health law in the U.S., Massachusetts required machinery guarding, elevator safety guards, fire exit protections, ventilation, and accident reporting. It set a precedent for state inspection systems and influenced other states to adopt similar laws. scienceinsights.org

2. Federal Employers Liability Act (FELA, 1908)

Enacted in response to deadly railroad conditions, FELA held railroad employers liable for injuries or deaths caused by negligence. It gave injured workers a legal avenue to seek compensation, though proving employer fault was required vigilife.com.

3. First Workers' Compensation Laws (1902, Maryland)

Maryland's 1902 law extended protections to workers in hazardous industries, though it was struck down in 1904. Wisconsin's 1911 law survived and became the first lasting workers' compensation system, eventually adopted by all states by 1948 www.occutech.com.

4. Bureau of Labor Act (1884)

Created the Bureau of Labor Statistics to collect labor data, laying the groundwork for the Department of Labor and later federal safety enforcement vigilife.com.

5. Fair Labor Standards Act (1938)

While primarily about minimum wage and child labor, it expanded federal authority over working conditions and set a foundation for future safety standards scienceinsights.org.



6. Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA, 1970)

The most comprehensive federal safety law, OSHA gave the federal government the power to enforce workplace safety standards, conduct inspections, and require employers to provide safe working conditions. It created the Occupational Safety and Health Administration to oversee compliance scienceinsights.org.

7. Mining Safety Acts (e.g., Pennsylvania, 1869; federal Bureau of Mines, 1907)

These laws mandated safety evaluations, improved ventilation, and reduced mining fatalities, marking the first federal agency dedicated to investigating mine safety scienceinsights.org.

Why These Acts Matter

Together, these laws shifted workplace safety from being a local improvisation to a federal responsibility. They addressed both immediate hazards (like locked factory doors and unsafe machinery) and systemic issues (like employer negligence and lack of compensation). The OSHA Act of 1970 remains the cornerstone of modern U.S. workplace safety law, but earlier acts like FELA, workers' compensation, and state factory laws were critical steppingstones.

The reality of all the progress our nation has made has come at a cost. American workers lives were lost for unsafe working conditions that eventually couldn't be ignored anymore. Also profit and greed has diluted safety legislation by lobbying corrupt politicians to demonize safety regulations that keep you safe as **"Job Killing Regulations"**.

UAW Safety Representative can help get your problems resolved and resolved quickly. Your UAW Safety Representatives were appointed by the union to help and represent you; the people selected by the company were not selected for those reasons. Caterpillar is responsible for our safety every minute we're at work. We must make sure we report hazards to our supervisors. If your problem is not addressed in what you feel is a timely manner, ask to see your UAW Safety Representative and file a complaint. (FYI, there is no "repetitive" language in 8.3, the Safety Complaint Procedure). The contractual Safety Complaint Procedure is the best way to document hazards and get them corrected.

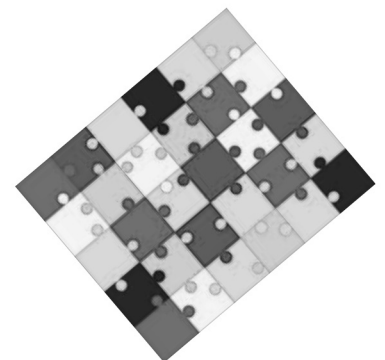

BARGAINING CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – AUGUST 2026

Greetings Brothers and Sisters,

The current docket numbers are 5 issue grievances and 4 just cause grievance.

The Chairman of the Grievance Committees have ran the Triennial Steward Elections. We have about 25 brand new Stewards and around 15 newer Stewards with Less than one year. I am currently working on sending 20 of these Stewards to Basic Summer School grievance training in Ottawa for a week. This training will be July 26, 2026, through July 31, 2026.

For the Steward meetings we have taken a break from finishing the Contract as we have a few Articles left to cover in the local language. I have decided with all the newer Stewards to go back to the basics and cover things that they will be dealing with. Filing their first grievance and covering the grievance process to give them a good idea on what to expect.

This year there is a Ag-Imp Conference in Chattanooga Tennessee on August 25, 2026, through August 28, 2026. Those that go will be able to tour the VW plant that was recently organized by UAW and have a new contract. Vice President Chuck Browning recently retired, and his last order of business was to negotiate their contract. Chuck Browning worked with us during the 2023 negotiations, and all his knowledge will be missed.

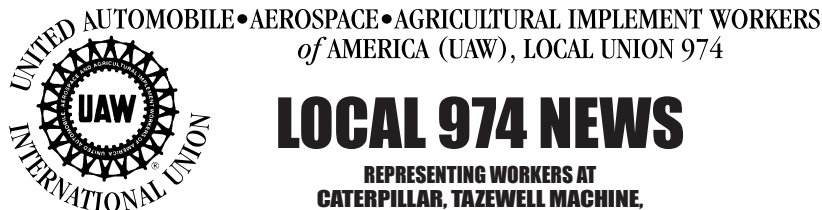
