BARGAINING CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



TERRY FISCHER

I hope the Membership and their families who took their vacations in July had an enjoyable and safe vacation.

As of June 22, 2015, Local 974 has 10 active grievances:

- 3 discharges
- 4 suspensions
- 3 issues

The next scheduled arbitration dates...

- --Just cause Arbitration dates >> August 12 & 13
- Open dates; Sept. 17 Morton.
- --Issue Arbitration dates >> September 9th 10th & 24th.

On June 23rd, Decatur Local 751 and the International Union received the Issue Arbitration Award for a Decatur grievance 15-DEC-214, that was arbitrated on March 24th. Arbitrator Phyllis Florman's decision: The grievance must be, and, is sustained in part. The Grievant's discharge will be treated as a disciplinary suspension with full seniority but without back pay. The Company also shall submit a new one year Last Chance Agreement wherein the Company shall clearly define the Grievant's attendance requirements and the circumstances which will result in his discharge during the term of the LCA.

On June 17th, the Company announced 120 members in the East Peoria – IMOD facilities, were being indefinitely laid off starting June 29th. These layoffs affected members in Bldg. BB, HH, LL, NN & SS.

Then on June 22nd, the Company made another announcement of 53 members being laid off in Bldg. KK, E. Peoria facility.

At June's Steward Council meetings, we discussed these layoffs and the impact to the other members that were not laid off. It is important that all questions regarding moves made due to the Company's decision to conduct this Reduction-in-Force (RIF), are brought to the attention of the Grievance Committeemen. The Grievance Committeemen will present all questions regarding the moves with Labor Relations within the respective divisions.

The Company also announced TLO weekly shutdowns at the East Peoria Facilities. In Building SS, members on the main line assembly area are scheduled for TLO weekly shutdowns from July 19th until August 15th & September 27th until October 31st.

In Bldg. KK, a TLO weekly shutdown for August 23rd until 29th was announced with more weekly TLO's later this year a possibility. There are other areas/departments within the East Peoria facilities that are still utilizing TLO's at management's discretion.

While I am on the subject of TLO's, I want to advise the Membership that when the supervisor informs each member of a scheduled TLO, start requesting written, signed, and dated information from the supervisor for the specific start date and return date of the TLO. There has been several instances where the supervisors verbally told our members the dates, but there was a communication breakdown on the return dates and because there was no written information or witnesses, disciplinary action was taken against the member(s). Ask for this written information to avoid any misunderstanding with a conversation on TLO dates.

A reminder with business being slow, management is micro-managing their workplace policies on the shop floor; personal time – breaks – cell phone usage – lunch times – start up and quitting times – absenteeism, etc. Be aware of what is happening around the work areas and be accountable for the time and actions in the workplace.

Social Media is creating more adverse conditions in the work place. Management is monitoring the social media networks and is using this information to take disciplinary action against the Membership. Use extreme caution and common sense when posting work related items on these sites.

In September, we celebrate and honor the Labor movement from years past to present and for the future for generations to come. On September 5th, Local 974 will have their annual Labor Day Picnic at Local 974 Hall from 11:00 am until 2:00 pm. Then on Monday, September 7th there is a



Keynote speaker Vice-President Norwood Jewell... A member of Local 659 where he was Alternate Committeeman, then Committeeman.

Former Director Region 1C and former Vice-President Dick Shoemaker assigned Norwood to G.M. Norwood is currently a member of the Democratic Party in Michigan.

Norwood said he would be working to prevent the trans-pacific partnership bill.
