INSURANCE & BENEFITS REPORT

JOHN ARNOLD ————

Well fall is here and it's my favorite time of year. It's also close to Annual Enrollment time. But before I get into that I need to address the letter Caterpillar sent out to the retirees that retired from January 10, 2005 through March 26, 2017. You are being offered the same benefit choices that the employees now are being offered when they retire. You have the choice of either staying with the same plan you are under now or switching to the new plan.

If you want to switch to the new plan and you are under the age of 65 you will have four (4) insurance plans to pick from. Those four (4) options are described in the booklet that was mailed out to you. You will be under this plan until you turn 65 at which time you will go on Medicare. Once you turn 65, or if you are 65 and older right now, and you choose to go into the new plan being offered you will no longer be on Caterpillar insurance. You will receive \$3,000 per person per year to buy a supplemental plan to go along with your Medicare coverage. I want to repeat, if you choose to get into this new plan being offered to you, and once you turn 65 you will NOT be on Caterpillar insurance any longer. You will get \$3,000 per person per year for a supplemental policy to go along with your Medicare coverage.

For some of you this may be a good option for you to get into and others not so much. So please look at the booklet closely and see if the new option is going to be the best for you. If you have any questions please call my office and I will do my best to answer them. <u>BUT</u> you only have until October 6th to opt out of the new plan. You have to call (309) 675-1700 if you <u>DO NOT</u> want to enroll in this new plan option you are being offered. If you retired from January 10, 2005 to March 26, 2017 and you don't call this number to tell them you wish to opt out of this new plan option and want to stay in the plan you have now you will <u>automatically</u> default into this new plan.

Now onto Annual Enrollment. The dates for this will be November 6th through November 24th. If there are any changes you wish to make for next year's coverage this is the time to do so. As always this office will be very busy, so please call and make an appointment if you are needing help during the enrollment period. If you have opted out of Caterpillar insurance and are looking to get back on this is the time to do so. Just know that you may be required to show you have had creditable coverage for the past 12 months.

As always I am here to help in any way possible. If I don't have an answer for you I will find someone that will.
