

INSURANCE & BENEFITS REPORT

JOHN ARNOLD _____

Happy Spring everyone! The Benefits Office has had some interesting issues come up since my last article. First off, the Caterpillar Benefits Center started an audit of the Pension Department. With this audit some retirees or surviving spouses received notification that their pension was under paid and were given a check to make up the loss of earnings. But other retirees or surviving spouses got a letter saying they were overpaid and Caterpillar wanted the money back. The amount of money Caterpillar wanted back ranged from \$3,300 to \$18,300. The audit went back at least 17 years. Unfortunately, a 78-year-old surviving spouse was the one that owes Caterpillar \$18,300 going back 15 years.

The second big issue that has happened recently is the ruling that came down from the 6th Circuit Court of Appeals concerning the Survivor's Spouse Lawsuit. They gave a split ruling that makes no sense at all. They ruled that if a member had retired and died before January 10, 2005 then their surviving spouse would not be subjected to pay monthly premiums. But they ruled that if a member retired before January 10, 2005 and died after January 10, 2005 their surviving spouse would be subjected to monthly premiums.

So, some of you have received a letter talking about this issue. I have talked to the law firm that is representing the surviving spouses and they are in the process of filing a stay so that Caterpillar can't start charging monthly premiums to those surviving spouses until the appeal can be heard from this latest ruling. The law firm is planning on appealing this decision by the 6th Circuit to the next level, which is the U.S. Supreme Court. This is only my opinion but if this case is heard by them, they will most likely rule in Caterpillar's favor. I will update you all in future articles once I get more information. For right now I haven't heard of any plans by Caterpillar to start charging premiums. They will most likely wait until the court rules on the stay.

RETIREES - Medicare Reimbursement

From time to time, I remind our retirees about the Medicare Part B reimbursement portion of our plan. If you or your spouse are Medicare age, 65, and enrolled in Medicare Part A & B, you are eligible for reimbursement of the Part B Premium. **The Plan will reimburse your Medicare premium up to \$99.50 per month every January and July.** This only pertains to members and spouses that opted out of the management/executive plan and retired prior to March 26, 2017. **You must contact Alight Solutions (Hewitt) at 1-877-228-4010 to enroll for the reimbursement. Once you're signed up, you won't have to sign-up again.**

All of the business units are experiencing a slow down in business except East Peoria Undercarriage and the Morton facilities. These are usually least affected by a downturn in business.
