Greetings Brothers & Sisters,



INSURANCE & BENEFITS REPORT

JOHN ARNOLD -

Hello everyone! Fall has started and football season is upon us. This is my favorite time of year when the temperature starts dropping and the leaves start to change. I hope everyone is being safe out there. I'm writing this article the first week of September and I hope by the time you are reading this that everything has remained opened, and nothing has been cancelled.

I wrote in my last article that I probably would not have the premiums for 2022 and unfortunately, I was correct. The next newsletter won't come out until December for me to include next years premiums. So please look on our website periodically to see if I have posted them once this newsletter hits your mailboxes. Maybe by mid-October is when I would start checking the website. Our website is www.uawlocal974.org and look under the Benefits tab.

I am expecting the premiums to go up again next year. With that said, I want to show the retirees that are on Medicare how I look at your premiums. Using this year's premium of \$234.56 for a single person I'll show you that you're actually paying less than that. It all starts with you signing up for Medicare reimbursement through the Cat Benefits Center. Once you get signed up you will be getting a reimbursement of \$99.50 per month. That reimbursement is paid out every January and July in your pension checks. Those two months you will get an extra \$597.00 added onto your monthly pension check.

Now even though the program is called "Medicare Reimbursement" I wouldn't look at it that way. You HAVE to be on Medicare since you are 65 or older so you are going to have to pay that premium out of your Social Security check no matter what. If I were in your shoes and getting this reimbursement, I would apply it to the Caterpillar premium you're paying. Doing this would make your Caterpillar premium actually \$135.06 per month for this year. (Ex. \$234.56 – \$99.50 = \$135.06) or \$270.12 per month for a married couple instead of \$469.12. You can't find a supplemental plan to Medicare that covers medical, prescription, dental and vision for \$135.00 per month on the open market. Obviously that \$135.00 will change depending on what the 2022 premium is going to be.

With the next newsletter coming out in December I want to wish everyone a safe and happy Thanksgiving.

RETIREES - Medicare Reimbursement

From time to time, I remind our retirees about the Medicare Part B reimbursement portion of our plan. If you or your spouse are Medicare age, 65, and enrolled in Medicare Part A & B, you are eligible for reimbursement of the Part B Premium. **The Plan will reimburse your Medicare premium up to \$99.50 per month every January and July.** This only pertains to members and spouses that opted out of the management/executive plan and retired prior to March 26, 2017. **You must contact Alight Solutions (Hewitt) at 1-877-228-4010 to enroll for the reimbursement. Once you're signed up, you won't have to sign-up again.**





ASK THE EXPERT

Hello again to all UAW members I hope everyone is doing their part in staying Healthy and safe during the surge in Covid-19 cases. It seems like this nightmare will never end.

So here is a question for you. If you were asked whether you would let a loved one perform the jobs we currently do, with the same equipment, following the same processes, what would you do? Do you feel that when you perform your job, you are exposed to job place hazards? If you are, then would you be comfortable with a loved one being exposed to the same hazard? If not, why is it good enough for you?

If you know it is there, why don't you ask your Supervisor to have it corrected? You are required to do so under the provisions of 8.3 of the Health and Safety Language, "An employee who believes that a condition has developed which presents a significant threat to his health or safety shall promptly notify his/her Supervisor of such conditions.(not a teamlead)". The union's best instrument for improving your health and safety is you! Don't get suckered into Caterpillar Rewards program! Its main focus is to reward individuals for bad behavior by working out of process and unsafe. If you have to work around or walk over trip hazards, tell your boss, and if he/she doesn't address it to your satisfaction, file a complaint. Any time your feet leave the floor, especially if you're four feet or more above the floor and you can't maintain three points of contact, you are at risk of fall. If your coolant is bad or if you have to breathe air that you can see, your boss needs to know. If you're required to lift something that is over your facility maximum or any lift that causes pain, report it.

Do you know that you are responsible for every word of every Safe Job Procedure, Standard Work, CPS or CLMS class you are required to take or have taken? Do you really take time to read the information? When the time of year comes around and management is pressuring UAW members to do their required learning, are you reading through the material or just filling the answers in that you saved from the year before? I actually witnessed two individuals calling for management to help them correct their cheat sheet and management was more than helpful because they don't care if you know the information. They just want to make sure they are hitting all their metrics to ensure they get a nice big bonus. In the event something happens, you'll be sure to see any and all of these documents, plus some that you've forgotten about. Believe me, they will be used as evidence of your "wrongdoing" in a disciplinary action.

Your UAW Health and Safety Representatives are there to help members address safety concerns when management is not taking member's hazard concerns serious. If your supervisor is not taking action, call for your UAW Safety Representative and file a complaint. C.I. cards are there to slow the process up to 30 days or longer. You are the expert on your job. Give your boss a chance to address your health and safety issues, but don't settle for anything but being satisfied with the resolution. Always remember why you go to work each day and those who depend on you.

Caterpillar is continuing to hire in all of our business units. Please take the time to welcome new members that enter your areas.

Just to touch on some COVID-19 issues there have been a lot of calls with concerns that the company is not extending benefits with the uptick in new positive cases and quarantines. Rest assure it's not due to the Local and International not trying to get those benefits reinstated. If you find yourself in a situation where the company does not let you work due to COVID-19, please call me as soon as possible to discuss options.

To follow up on the arbitration that took place on April 8, 2021, pertaining to an overtime grievance out of Mapleton, that grievance was denied. I have to say that I'm not sure what the arbitrator was ruling on, but he was nowhere close to the issue at hand. Specifically quoting verbiage from what he said was in the transcripts that did not exist. That arbitrator has been fired and will be replaced with one that is hopefully capable of ruling on the issues in hand.

There are currently 7 issue and 7 just cause grievances on the docket.


The next General Council meeting will be October 10, 2021, and the next Steward meeting will be October 28th. I hope to see everyone there.


