Greetings Brothers & Sisters,



Daulton Todd Simmers, 28, lost his life in a tragic, unnecessary, horrible accident at our Mapleton Foundry on June 6, 2024. He left behind his heartbroken fiancé and 2 children whose lives will never be the same.

This tragedy was 100% avoidable and largely due to improper, inadequate training in my opinion. We have so many new members that have been hired in the last few years and a lot of them have been rushed through training and are also being trained by other new members. A lot of these people are still supplemental members who are probably afraid to say they feel unsafe or don't feel properly trained. We need to protect our new people who may be too intimidated to speak up for themselves. If you see someone struggling to do their job due to not being properly trained on how to do their job safely, please speak up for them. Ask them if they feel unsafe doing their jobs and if they need more training. If their answer is yes, please make sure it happens so we never lose another brother or sister.

RETIREES - Medicare Reimbursement

From time to time, I remind our retirees about the Medicare Part B reimbursement portion of our plan. If you or your spouse are Medicare age, 65, and enrolled in Medicare Part A & B, you are eligible for reimbursement of the Part B Premium. **The Plan will reimburse your Medicare premium up to \$99.50 per month every January and July.** This only pertains to members and spouses that opted out of the management/executive plan and retired prior to March 26, 2017. **You must contact Alight Solutions (Hewitt) at 1-877-228-4010 to enroll for the reimbursement. Once you're signed up, you won't have to sign-up again.**

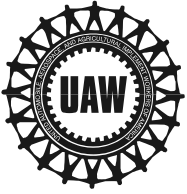

WHO'S NEXT?

Loren Meyers, Plantwide Safety Chairman

At Caterpillar's Mapleton foundry, Brother Daulton T. Simmers, 28, suffered severe thermal burns throughout his body and was pronounced dead at around 5 p.m. Thursday June 6, 2024. Sheriff Chris Watkins said that Simmers had been trying to transfer molten metal from a large furnace into a smaller pot. However, the molten iron estimated about 45,000 pounds and at a temperature of 2500 degrees spilled out, engulfing Simmers in fire and molten metal. Brother Simmers was loved by his Family and friends and will be greatly missed. Brother Daulton was your average hardworking young man trying to support his family. Daulton was excited when he was hired by Caterpillar because after a couple of failed employment opportunities, he finally felt he was achieving the American dream and able to marry his long-time fiancé Lindsey Downing and start a life with their two children. Daulton and Lindsey were planning to get married few days after the accident occurred.

Almost two years to the day On Thursday, June 2, 2022 Steven Matthew Dierkes, 39, of Peoria, IL, passed away at 9:23 a.m. after falling into a molten iron crucible at the Caterpillar company's Mapleton, Illinois foundry. Steven was on his 6th day of furnace operator training performing temperature and thermal sampling, at a temperature of over 2,600 degrees. Steven was the second fatality at the Mapleton facility in the last 7 months leading up to his death.

What is it going to take for Management to change its incompetent strategies to minimize hazards and safety for higher production. THIS HAS TO STOP. It doesn't matter which business unit you work in, Management is consistent in creating no accountability for themselves. Management has created such a toxic work environment that our members are given no choice but to comply or be a target. Brother Simmons and Brother Dierkes where new employees (supplemental) that where both given little training and proper supervision in an hazardous environment, and because of their supplemental status they wanted to do a good job and not complain so they can get hired for full time. As Plantwide safety chair for East Peoria and safety committeeman for KK and H I hear new supplementals say this all the time. April of this year I was called to H because for several weeks there was a 2nd shift employee that was working several different work stations and was contaminating the areas with blood from an undisclosed condition. Dayshift employees went to their dayshift section manager to do something about the contamination. Dayshift section manager had dayshift assembly workers clean up the blood without proper training and PPE. Building H has a cleaning service (4M) that is available for that reason but the 4M cleaning crew would have to shut down the effective areas to clean them properly. 1st shift section manager was more concerned about production then health and welfare of his employee's. Two full time UAW members called for a UAW safety representative because the majority of the dayshift employees where supplementals and too afraid to complain but were concerned for their safety. Management minimizing the hazard is a collective effort considering that when I brought this to management's attention, they did everything possible to protect the dayshift section manager incompetents and gaslighting the bloodborne pathogens standard minimizing the hazard of dried blood. Dried blood is infectious up to a week with the hepatitis B virus and four days with hepatitis C. Management also invited me and my alternate safety rep. to attend a Bloodborne pathogen presentation given by our Nurse who tried to gaslight the issue too. The experts say all forms of blood should be treated the same. Divide and conquer is Managements favorite weapon. Management rewards team leads to break every rule with no accountability and now they are a huge part of workers production support because Manufacturing engineer created the ultimate toxic work environment by stripping workers of all production computer access and giving it to only team leads. So if your team lead is slow and incompetent it reflects on you not them.

To all my UAW brothers and sisters, we need to come together and honor our fallen by not allowing fear to keep us quiet. If you feel unsafe or see a hidden hazard, tell your supervisor if he blows you off and tells you to fill out a C.I card ask for your UAW safety Representative.

Discipline has always been high on Caterpillar’s list when they slow down.
